## *Presidential Points*

Hi everyone, welcome to another On The Edge newsletter.

Yes we know it's been a long time since the last one. As you have probably guessed this is an indication of just how busy things have been in 2014 and it looks like 2015 will be even more so. Rest assured we have been looking after things.

Finally we have been officially gazetted for our dagger exemption. This process was supposed to take three months but it ended up at being closer to eighteen. A copy of our listing can be found in the newsletter, it would be recommended that each Full member print one out and have it ready to be produced as a backup with your current membership card should you ever need to. We've never had any problems with authorities but you never know when it might happen so it's better to be safe than sorry.

An updated version of our constitution will soon be available. Before last year's meeting it was pointed out that a section to do with probationary membership was missing. It had been omitted by mistake and will be replaced as originally printed. The only change to be included will be the new Family membership which was voted in by majority vote at the AGM.

Some of you may know through ABF and from discussions at the Sydney show that we have secured a new insurance policy. Our old policy only covered us at Guild sanctioned shows which was pretty limited. One of Karim's students who works as an insurance broker has negotiated for us a very good policy that couldn't be better for all concerned. Members - Probationary and Full Voting - are covered for things such as shows (not just Guild ones) markets, craft shows, everything we would need to display and sell knives, as well as public liability. It even covers us for public displays as long as the work area is roped off to a safe distance from the public. It covers us for personal injury in our workshops as well as any students or visitors that enter your shop. For those who don't know much about insurance let me tell you that this kind of policy would be impossible to get any other way and as an individual if you could get it, then it would cost thousands per year. Even the woodworkers guild who many of us previously joined for their cover are no longer insuring any more knife makers.

The downside is that the new cover costs substantially more than the old one, around \$4000 a year to be exact. To be able to pay this, the Guild has increased the membership for the maker levels to \$100 a year. So far everyone has been very supportive of this which is greatly appreciated. If you need to quote the policy details, the insurer is Civic Insurance Brokers and the number is LCB018520669. For a printable Certificate of Currency with your name and membership number on it please email your request to [secretary@akg.org.au](mailto:secretary@akg.org.au) and it will be forwarded to you. Please note, to be covered by the insurance your membership must be current, paid to date in full.

For those who weren't at the AGM this year, we put much discussion into finding a new show venue and Mike Maison put forward several choices for us to look at. From this list we chose the Best Western Airport Motel and Convention Centre which we think everyone will be very happy with. If you do not have a copy of the Exhibitor's Guide for the show then email [secretary@akg.org.au](mailto:secretary@akg.org.au) immediately as time is getting on and we need to confirm numbers. One public mailout has already been done and at the Lost Trades Fair there were over 600 fliers distributed so there is a great deal of public interest now. The Guild facebook page is also proving to be very popular with nearly 1000 likes so far. If you are on facebook, please go to the AKG page and share the show event with your friends and other related groups you might be part of to spread the word. Look forward to seeing you there.

# AGM MINUTES 2014

Australian Knifemakers Guild  
Annual General Meeting Held at the Hotel Ibis  
Saturday May 3, 2014

President Adam Parker opened the meeting at 5pm and welcomed all present.

Apologies – Matt Brook, David Brodziak, Bruce Barnett, Mike Petersen, Keith Fludder, Alistair Phillips, Mal Hannan, Stewart Townsend, Peter Bald, Scott Broad, Doug Timbs.

Last years' AGM minutes were read by Secretary/Treasurer Rob Herbert and presented as a true and accurate record. Moved: Adam Parker. Seconded: Shawn McIntyre.

Matters arising – Probationary members voted to full membership were: Anthony Eglinton, Nathan Roennfeldt. All were unanimously accepted.

Reports –

President

Adam Parker spoke about the rise in membership due to an increasing AKG presence on Australian Blade Forums and through promotion via his own courses. He encouraged members to take opportunities to promote the Guild where appropriate. Adam thanked ABF for their involvement and assistance in Guild events.

Adam also talked about displaying knives and demonstrating forging at the first Lost Trades Fair in Kyneton earlier in the year and how much of a success it was. He will consult further with the organisers for promotion and ideas to improve next years' Melbourne Show. He also attended the bi-annual Wild Deer Show in Bendigo in February which contributed to raffle ticket sales and show awareness.

Adam paid tribute to the late Maurie McCarthy, speaking of his talent and skills as well as his long-standing involvement in the Guild. He expressed that Maurie would be very much missed by all who had known him and that it had been a privilege to call him a friend.

Secretary/Treasurer

Rob Herbert stated that the Guild's bank balance was \$6556.82 as at May 3, 2014 and discussed payments yet to be made from the existing funds. Rob talked about the necessity of increasing membership to keep the Guild financially viable and how awareness could be increased via social media. Corin Urquhart talked about the ease of using social media to promote show awareness and his experiences in that area, and Karim asked for more patronage of the Guild's facebook page.

The reports were presented and moved to be accepted by Adam Parker. Seconded: Terri Parker.

Election of Office Bearers – It was established that the presidency would be a two year term and that Secretary/Treasurer would be one year term to stagger office bearer change over. The position of President was declared open and Adam Parker nominated for the position of Presidency. Unanimously accepted. The position of Secretary/Treasurer was declared open. Matthew McVicar nominated for position of treasurer. Unanimously accepted. Terri Parker nominated for the position of Secretary. Unanimously accepted.

Show committee – President Adam Parker called for nominations. Rob Herbert volunteered, with Mike Maison and Zac Cheong.

General Business - Adam spoke of last year discussing the junior/family membership and presented his proposal which outlined the inclusion of younger members from the age of fourteen to eighteen to be given membership alongside a parent/guardian. Discussion was had about details of the new membership. Adam proposed the vote, moved Mike Maison, Seconded: Rob Herbert. Unanimously accepted.

Discussion was had about the joining fees for Associate Members. Discussion was had about the removal of the joining fee. Mike moved that the joining fee be removed. Seconded: Adam. Terri moved that Associate Membership fee be raised to \$40 annually. Seconded: Peter Del Raso. Mike discussed Associate Membership perks and proposed that it be added that they get into show for free. Moved: Mike Maison. Seconded: Adam Parker.

Discussion was had about attracting passers-by into the show. Mike presented his findings on investigating a new venue and discussion was had about dissatisfaction with current venue. Karim suggested that the show committee was to be given the task of looking into an alternate venue. Mike moved that this research be undertaken. Seconded: Shawn McIntyre.

Corin presented his update regarding the upcoming International Cutlers Exhibition in Sydney. He addressed the concerns of some members who were unsure of what was included in the cost and talked about the progress in getting the show organised. He offered the Guild a complimentary table for promotional purposes.

Honorary Members Mike Maison and Fred Rowley were up for re-election. Moved: Adam Parker Seconded: Terri Parker.

The next AGM was announced for Saturday May 2, 2015, subject to venue and date availability.

Closing – with no further business to be discussed the meeting was closed by President Adam Parker at 6.15pm.

### Conditions

A person seeking to rely on this Order is subject to the following conditions:

#### General Conditions

1. *Use:* A dagger may only be used for the purposes for which the exemption was granted.
2. *Storage:* When not being used in accordance with the purposes specified in this Order, daggers must be stored safely and securely.

AKG KNIFE SHOW 2015  
GUILD REGULATIONS

In accordance with the Australian Knifemakers Guild (AKG) constitution, no maker will have for display, or have in their possession for sale, any of the following items:

- Automatic knives
- Push daggers
- Sword canes
- Butterfly knives
- Buckle knives
- Factory made knives including factory kits.

In order to protect the Guild's reputation and Victorian Knife laws, anyone found breaching these regulations will be asked to pack up and leave. No exceptions.

Under Victorian legislation Non-members & Probationary members are not permitted to display Daggers or other double edged knives without the appropriate permit(s).

Knife Awards and Judging

We encourage all Full & Probationary makers to enter knives into the competition.

For any maker entering a knife for judging, please follow these steps:

1. Locate in your pack the numbered adhesive labels
2. For any knife you wish to enter – place one of these numbered labels over your mark
3. Once your mark is covered, place your knife(s) on the judging tables in the appropriate category ensuring the knife meets the requirements of the category
4. Judging commences at 8.30 am sharp and concludes at 9.00 am Saturday
5. Late knives are not accepted & only ONE entry per category

Full and Probationary AKG members attending the show may participate in the voting. The Show Committee will announce when the voting commences.

1. You will find a voting slip in your pack, in the appropriate box, write the number that appears on the knife you consider to be the best in the category
2. Place your completed slips in the collection box.

Awards Requirements

Following are the requirements knives submitted for judging must meet.

- 1) All knives must be for sale at the Guild show
- 2) No piece to have been previously submitted for judging at any other knife show
- 3) Where minimum or maximum blade lengths are stipulated, the blade length is measured from the point to the grind shoulder at the ricasso
- 4) Knives submitted for Best Forged Non Damascus and Best Damascus must be the work of the maker submitting the piece. Collaborations are accepted and the award is shared between the two or more makers
- 5) The maximum price on the
  - a. Hunter category is \$400 and must include a sheath
  - b. Utility Knife is \$275 and must include sheath
- 6) The AKG will purchase the winning hunter or utility for the next year's Raffle prize

## 2015 Knife Show Judging Criteria

- 1) All knives must be for sale at the Guild Show
- 2) No piece to have been previously submitted for judging at any other knife show.
- 3) The length of the blade is measured from the point to the grind shoulder at the ricasso.

The categories are as follows:

### Best In Show

- To epitomise the Guild standards in quality, design and construction.
- The best 'fit and finish'.
- Innovative in design and presentation.
- Degree of difficulty in manufacture.
- Presentation.

### Folder

- This knife should display outstanding 'fit and finish'.
- The knife should have a smooth 'walk' and definite 'talk' on both opening and closing.
- The folder should display excellence in design and display the desirable properties of beauty, ease of use, strength, and absence of bulk.

### Forged/Damascus

- Originality and/or excellence of design.
- Degree of difficulty in manufacture.
- Selection of materials.
- High degree of fit and finish.
- Must be forged to shape by the maker presenting the knife for judging.

### Utility

- This knife can sell for up to \$275 and must include a sheath.
- It must represent value for money.
- The blade length must not be less than 11cm.
- Appropriateness of design for a general purpose knife.
- The fit and finish should at the least be of a standard that would be approved by the Guild as a satisfactory quality.

### Hunter

- The knife can sell for up to \$400 and must include a sheath.
- The blade length must not be less than 9cm.
- This is a practical knife and should be able to perform a number of tasks with relative ease in the field dressing medium to large game.
- This knife should display excellent fit and have a very good finish.
- The knife should represent appropriate value for money.

### Small Game

- Must have a high standard of fit and finish.
- Suitable for dressing small game/fish.
- Blade must not exceed 7.5cm.
- The knife can sell for up to \$300.


